Nomination process	<p>Nominations can be submitted via the International Exchange (or Erasmus) Officer at the home university. This officer will send the application request (nomination) to Fontys.</p> <p>* For all Arts exchange programmes there are different application rules and deadlines: please carefully check the specific information on the programme of your interest.</p>	
Application process	<p>Once Fontys has received the nomination, the Fontys study department of choice will send the student a link to a web application called Mobility Online. Please take a look here to see how it works.</p>

<p>Once Fontys has accepted the application in Mobility Online the student will be guided through the process of enrolment and the arrangement of practical issues including accommodation, visa (depending on the nationality) and insurance.</p>		
Visa	<p>To enter the Netherlands for the purpose of studying, students may require a visa and/or residence permit. Please visit fontys.edu for more visa information.</p>	
Accommodation	<p>It is not easy for international students to find accommodation in the Netherlands. Therefore, Fontys University of Applied Sciences (Fontys) offers a service to provide exchange students with assistance in securing suitable furnished accommodation for their exchange semester or for Full Degree students for the first period of their studies.</p> <p>Fontys can only guarantee housing for a limited number of students. Therefore, we strongly recommend that students keep on trying to find a room themselves.</p>
